This local law provides as follows:

Amending Chapter 45. Building Construction, Article II. Administration and Enforcement, Section 45-10. Building permits, Subparagraph I.

§45-10. Building Permits

- I. Building permits shall become invalid unless the authorized work is commenced within six months following the date of issuance. Building permits shall expire twelve months after the date of issuance but may be renewed twice for a period of one year. If a project has begun and a code change is effected, that project may continue and be completed according to the codes in place at the time that project was started.


At such time all interested persons will be given as opportunity to be heard.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE TOWN OF ORCHARD PARK

2020

The Orchard Park Historical Society Board typically meets 5X per year on the first Monday in Jan., Mar., May, Sept.* and Nov. at 6:45 PM. The Orchard Park Historical Society membership of 120 meets on the 2nd Monday of Feb., Apr., June, Oct.* and Dec. Meeting dates vary slightly due to Labor Day and Columbus Day and meeting room availability. *This past year the global pandemic has forced us to suspend many of our activities although the Board continues to meet and work behind the scenes.*

According to our Log Book, there were at least 263 volunteer hours spent at the Jolls House meeting, leading tours for visitors, cleaning, decorating, rotating exhibits, etc. We are caretakers of the Jolls House Museum and diligently prepare for guided tours. In January we had a Holiday Open House and welcomed at least 36 visitors. In February we made the Jolls House available to the Orchard Park Library, which presented a "Story Hour". Five children attended.

Our Annual Scholarship, Millie's Birthday Party, the Harry Yates Volunteer of the Year Award, the Picnic, and festivities to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Jolls House did not happen, nor did our fundraising activities, the Fair exhibit, and Holiday Open Houses. A Yearbook Sharing event was also written off for the time being.

Another change this year came about as the Community Activity Center was completed and our meetings are shifting to this new location, rather than at the OP Municipal Center's basement meeting room.

There were some bright spots. We applied for, and were accepted to receive, some expert advice in preserving our archives by having a Document Heritage and Preservation Service Archival Needs Assessment from NYS Archives. This took place via zoom in July, and we have since received their printed report. It is very extensive and will take time to put into practice. We have our work cut out for us in 2021 and beyond to preserve the treasures that we have been entrusted with.

WNY Heritage Magazine published an article by our Publicity Chair, Chris Gibbons, entitled "The Jolls House: Orchard Park's Italianate Treasure Celebrates its Sesquicentennial". It contained a quote from the speaker (John G. Milburn) at Dr. Jolls' commencement from medical school in 1895, "Life is worth the struggle for the best that is in us." As a doctor, Dr. Jolls lived this. As volunteers, we live this.

The Orchard Park Garden Club decorated the exterior of the Jolls House for the holidays.

Some generous donors have helped to close our budget gap after we couldn't have our Annual Lawn Sale and Basket Raffle.

We continue to care for the interior of the Jolls House. This past year we had to hire an exterminator because squirrels got into the building, causing damage to several items and setting off the alarm.

We are thankful for the Town's assistance with repairs to the handicap elevator. We have been hoping to see some repairs to the porch, and are concerned about the age of the main furnace which we believe is 62 years old.

As mentioned, there were at least 263 volunteer hours spent at the Jolls House - this figure does not include hours spent contacting docents, typing letters, paying bill and more.
